<b>Role Title</b>
Volunteer Livestock Checker
<b>Purpose of your role:</b>
To ensure that the health and welfare of NWT livestock is of the highest standard so that our land can be managed effectively.
<b>Type of work you will be involved with:</b>
Check the sheep/ponies/cattle regularly: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• for signs of ill health or discomfort</li><li>• check that none are missing or separated from the flock/herd</li><li>•</li></ul> Report to your supervisor or a member of the reserves team if there is any problem
<b>Skills and abilities you will be using in your role:</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• You will need to live fairly local to reserves where livestock graze</li><li>• You must be reliable</li><li>• No experience necessary – training and comprehensive guidance will be given</li><li>• Ability to follow given health &amp; safety guidelines</li></ul>

With have livestock at various locations, mainly in the Breckland area but also across Norfolk
<b>Times/days we would like you to be available</b>
One or more days per week during livestock grazing period
