P. Sessilis – rust on lords and ladies

Acarospora fuscata – common lichen on tombstones

Acrocordia salweyi – frequent lichen on mortar and walls

Arthonia radiata – common lichen on smooth-barked trees

Aspicilia calcarea – common lichen on tombstones

Belonia nidarosiensis – common lichen on tombstones and walls

Caloplaca aurantia – common lichen on tombstones

C. Citrina – common lichen on walls and tombstones

C. Flavescens – common lichen on walls and tombstones

C. Dalmatica – frequent lichen on church walls

C. Saxicola – common lichen on walls and tombstones

Candelariella medians – common lichen on tombstones

Diploicia canescens – common lichen on trees, tombs and walls

Dirina massiliensis f. *Sorediata* – local lichen, on north walls of church

Flavoparmelia caperata – very common lichen on acid-barked deciduous trees
