

## Invasive Species Fact Sheet



### Japanese Knotweed

- Found in grasslands, woodlands, roadsides and urban areas
- Forms dense clumps
- Hollow red stems
- Height to 3m



### Bracken

- Found on heathlands, woodlands, hillsides and moorland
- Forms dense stands of branched fronds
- Height to 2m



### Himalayan Balsam

- Found in grasslands, woodlands and roadsides
- Hollow red stems
- Height to 3m



### Yellow Archangel

- Found in woodlands and roadsides
- Looks similar to a dead nettle but with yellow flowers

### Alexanders

- Found in grasslands and roadsides
- Umbrella shaped flower heads
- Hollow stems
- Height to 1.5m





### **New Zealand Pigmyweed**

- Found in aquatic habitats
- Has small white flowers with four petals
- Forms thick dense carpet with red stems
- Stems up to 0.30m long



### **Parrots Feather**

- Found in aquatic habitats
- Forms floating mats of feathery leaves
- Height to 0.10m



### **Water/Floating Pennywort**

- Found in aquatic habitats
- Forms dense floating mats
- Height to 0.4m



### **Winter Hellebore**

- Found in rough grasslands, roadsides, streamsides and woodland edges
- Forms large patches of round leaves
- Fragrant flower spikes in winter
- Height to 0.45m

### **Spanish Bluebell**

- Found in woodlands and roadsides
- Larger than English bluebells (height, leaves and flowers)
- Broad leaves about 1" wide
- Flowers 360° around stem
- Flowers in an open cone bell shape
- Pollen coloured pale blue
- Height to 0.45m
