• If we are visiting another site away from the meeting point, we will car share if it is too far to walk. If you want to join us on site instead of at the meeting point, please let us know, we can provide directions if needed.

• Please wear old working clothes, suitable for the weather. If you have them, bring reasonably sturdy shoes or boots, and rainwear. We will bring any tools and personal protective equipment (such as gloves, goggles or hard hats) if they are needed for a task.
