




#### **Map showing the County Wildlife Site Boundary**

#### **Habitat map**



#### **Habitat description:**

Species diverse broadleaved woodland, wet in the north, dry in the south. In the north there is area of marshy grassland. An area of acid grassland occurs towards the western edge of the woodland.

The southern part of the common (not included in 2014 survey) becomes increasingly coniferous, with a large stand of Rhododendron (*Rhododendron ponticum*) in the south-west. A newly created path links the central path to the east of the common with species including ling (*Calluna vulgaris*) and cross-leaved heath (*Erica tetralix*).

#### **Target Notes:**

1. South woodland – mixed woodland with dominant birch (Betula pedula), conifer and oak (Quercus robur). There is little shrub layer, mostly occasional holly (Ilex aquifolium). The eastern side (from the central north-south path) has scattered, small patches of Rhdodendron ponticum and some stands of young birch. There is frequent broad buckler (Dryopteris dilatata) fern in places and bracken (Pteridium aquilinum) dominates in some areas.

The newly created cycle path has path-side vegetation including rare cross-leaved heath (*Erica tetralix*), heather (*Calluna vulgaris*) and rushes (*Juncus* ssp.). There is

an area by the new path with deeply rutted vehicle tracks which had lying water in places, supporting floating sweet grass (*Glyceria fluitans*) and rushes.

The woodland to the north of the new path supports young oak and birch with bracken, male fern (*Dryopteris filix-mas*), broad buckler and occasional wood sorrel (*Oxalis acetosella*), enchanter's nightshade (*Circaea lutetiana*), wood avens (*Geum urbanum*) and rushes.

The western side of the southern woodland is similar but with large, scattered stands of Rhododendron. Variegated archangel (*Lamiastrum galeobdolon* subsp. *Argentatum*) occurs by the west edge of the central path - at present it seems limited to this area of the southern woodland.

- Acid grassland with a belt of bracken in front of mixed woodland Sheep's sorrel (Rumex acetosella) is occasional, as is sweet vernal grass (Anthoxanthemum odoratum), birdsfoot trefoil (Lotus corniculatus), germander speedwell (Veronica chamaedrys), red fescue (Festuca rubra), Yorkshire fog (Holcus lanatus), dovesfoot cranesbill (Geranium molle), lesser stitchwort (Stellaria graminea) and nettle (Urtica dioica). The grassland here is fenced, and was cut and cleared of bracken in 2018-19.
- 3. Large open areas of neutral-acid grassland mosaic bounded on all sides by woodland There is a scrubby stand of gorse (*Ulex europaeus*) in the south, and a belt of goat willow (*Salix caprea*) and blackthorn (*Prunus spinose*) scrub in the east with elder (*Sambucus nigra*) and dog rose (*Rosa canina* agg.). Bracken has been cleared here.

The grassland is tussocky in places to the north east, but otherwise has a quite fine sward. The grassland is moderately species rich with frequent meadow buttercup (*Ranunculus acris*), lesser stitchwort, germander speedwell and common vetch (*Vicia sativa*). Occasional species include sweet vernal grass, cocksfoot (*Dactylis glomerata*), creeping thistle (*Cirsium arvense*), field woodrush (*Luzula campestris*) and black medick (*Medicago lupulina*). Southern marsh orchid (*Dactylorhiza praetermissa*) is rare, occurring to the east of the grassland.

The sward near the gorse island is low and fine, supporting sheep's sorrel, lesser stitchwort, field woodrush, selfheal (*Prunella vulgaris*), cat's ear (*Hypochaeris radicata*), sweet vernal grass and common mouse ear (*Cerastium fontanum*). A damp-wet flush occurs in the south, adjoining the marshy grassland beyond the trees to the south.

- 4. Wet, alder (*Alnus glutinosa*) dominated woodland with patches of dominant remote sedge (*Carex remota*), also occasional lesser pond sedge (*Carex acutiformis*), rushes, sanicle (*Sanicula europaea*), bugle (*Ajuga reptans*), redcurrant (*Ribes rubrum*), guelder rose (*Viburnum opulus*) and honeysuckle (*Lonicera periclymenum*) threading through the ground flora and shrub layer. Marsh marigold (*Caltha palustris*) is rare. There are good amounts of both standing and fallen deadwood. The north boundary of the common is a wet ditch.
- 5. Marshy grassland supporting rushes and sedges *Carex* ssp., also marsh valerian (*Valeriana dioica*), watermint (*Mentha aquatic*), cuckooflower (*Cardamine pratensis*), common sorrel (*Rumex acetosa*), lesser spearwort (*Ranunculus flammula*), horsetail (*Equisetum* sp.), marsh pennywort (*Hydrocotyle vulgaris*), ragged robin (*Silene flosculi*) and meadowsweet (*Filipendula ulmaria*). A belt of goat willow and birch leads back into the coniferous part of the woodland to the south.

#### Other notable species:

CWS 1352 lies to the immediate north. Agricultural land to the east and west. The NDR lies to the immediate south.
